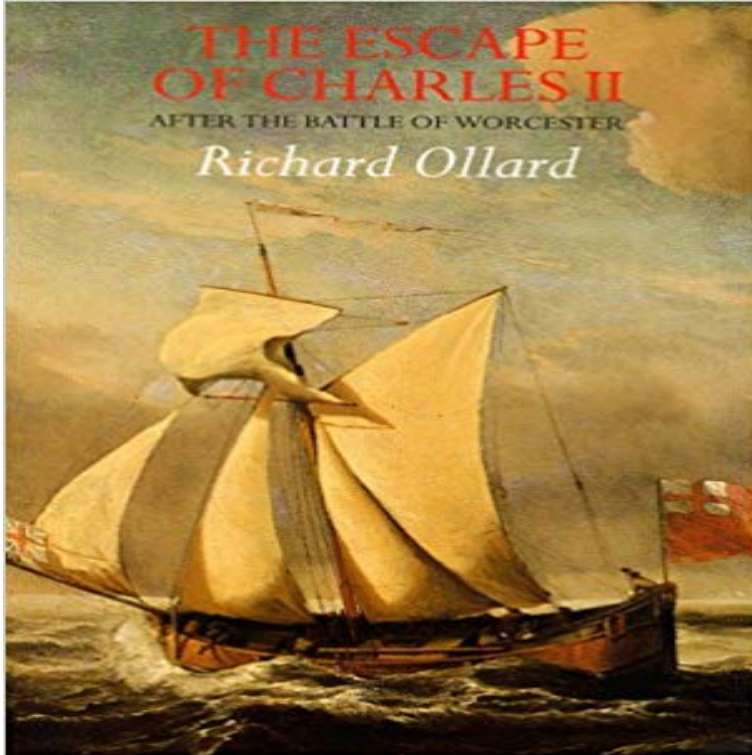


# The Escape of Charles II: After the Battle of Worcester (History and Politics)
